Move Rules

1. Respect others and yourself.
2. No guys in girl's dorms beyond the front lobby and vice versa.
3. Alcohol, tobacco, drugs and weapons are absolutely prohibited
4. Everyone must be in their dorms by the designated "In Dorm Time".
5. For security reasons, no students with backpacks are allowed into the auditorium or cafeteria.
6. Follow the schedule. Be where you are supposed to be when you are supposed to be there.
7. During sessions, stay in your assigned group seating. Please follow the posted seating chart.
8. Do not leave the auditorium once the speakers begin talking.
9. Respect the campus – no TP, water balloons, shaving cream, sidewalk chalk, etc. No practical jokes!
10. Do not move furniture as you will be charged for any assessed damage.
11. Do not dial 911 unless it is a true emergency.
12. Absolutely no fireworks at any time during MOVE or while on campus property.
13. No food deliveries of any kind to the campus.
14. Students may leave campus ONLY with adult supervision; those staying behind must have an adult present.
15. Follow the dress guidelines.

KINGDOM WORKERS

A Kingdom Worker is a Christian who uses whatever sphere of influence he or she has to proclaim the message of Jesus. Kingdom Workers include school teachers, moms, high school basketball players, bass guitarists, doctors and a countless list of others.

Their ministry may look different, but they have each surrendered to Jesus, and are committed to using their gifts, abilities and relationships to advance his Kingdom.

ELECTIVES

We give students the opportunity to encounter Kingdom Workers, hear Biblical truth taught and be exposed to some great Christian practices during elective time at Move. Electives are offered on a range of topics to provide ample opportunity for further discussion.

YOUTH GROUP TIME

Each night after the Evening Session, each group will get together to talk about the day and pray together.

THE NEXT LEVEL

This is an option for graduated seniors. The Next Level is an in-depth Bible study taught by the Morning Speaker while everyone else is in Encounter Time. This is a great opportunity for them to get an inside glimpse of each day's theme, ask questions, and be challenged in their faith.

SELAH TIME

Following the Morning Session, students and leaders are dismissed to Encounter Time and Small Groups. This creates an opportunity for them to participate in devotions that are tied to the daily themes. The devotions can be found in the Student Magazine.

AFTERNOON RECREATION

The options at every campus are different and will be announced at the event. MOVE organizes tournaments during some of the afternoons: 3-on-3 basketball, volleyball, ultimate frisbee and dodge ball.

MOVE Covid Precautions

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues, Christ In Youth is committed to offering events that inspire Kingdom work while prioritizing the health and safety of those in attendance. Many of the specifics related to the summer of 2021 are not yet known, but CIY is working with venue partners across the country to plan events with appropriate measures in place to create a safe environment. Additional details about plans for 2021 will be released in the coming months as more specific information is available. A few of the things that are known at this time are as follows:

- CIY will follow local, state, and federal guidelines related to events and the various aspects of the event environment (housing, dining, etc.).
- CIY is working with venue partners to enhance cleaning & sanitation procedures.
- CIY will adjust schedules, seating, housing, etc. to provide appropriate spacing based on current local conditions & guidelines.
- CIY will require pre-event and daily health screenings in order to quickly identify & isolate potential positive cases.

In addition to the items listed above, some measures currently considered to be best practices and likely to be implemented based on current conditions are:

Face Coverings

- In all indoor spaces where groups are gathering
- Outdoors in areas where social distancing cannot be maintained

Social Distancing

- Auditorium seating adjustments and/or duplication of sessions
- Additional meal shifts in cafeterias

Cohorts

- Organization of youth groups into cohorts to help limit exposure risk and assist with contact tracing should exposure occur

Cleaning & Sanitization

- Increased sanitization and cleaning schedules in all occupied buildings
- Sanitizing stations in/near auditorium, cafeteria, and other regularly used buildings

Daily Screening for Staff & Attendees

- Temperature checks
- Symptom related questionnaire

Testing & Isolation

- Access to rapid testing for symptomatic individuals
- Designated isolation locations during testing
- No contact or reduced contact recreation options with increased sanitization for contact equipment

CIY regularly monitors the CDC website as well as state government information in regions where events are scheduled and will continue to adjust plans accordingly. The hope is that by the time summer 2021 arrives, the need for these measures is limited. However, the safety of attendees, staff, and speakers is incredibly important, and CIY will take necessary precautions to prioritize the health and wellbeing of guests at events.

Lee University - Big 10 Questions

1 How many people stay to a room and what style are the rooms?

Most rooms are suite style, with 2 rooms connected by a bathroom. We have a few dorms that are traditional style dorms, with each room opening to the hallway and sharing a community bathroom. Both the traditional and suite-style rooms sleep 2 to a room. We also have apartment style dorms. These dorms have 2 rooms, 2 bathrooms, a living area and a kitchen in each apartment. The apartment as a whole sleeps 4 (2 to a room.)

NOTE: Room assignments are based on registration date.

2 What types of bathrooms are available in the dorms?

There will either be between 2 rooms (4 to a bathroom), community restrooms allowing the whole hall to use them, or apartment style (3 to a bathroom).

3 Are the dorms air-conditioned?

Yes, every dorm is air-conditioned.

4 Is there a pool on campus?

No, we do not have an on campus pool. There is a community pool in the city if needed.

5 What kinds of recreation options are available on campus?

We have 2 outdoor volleyball courts, an outdoor basketball court and multiple tennis courts. There is also an intramural softball field, a playground and many open field spaces.

6 What is the distance between the dorms, the main meeting space and cafeteria?

Everything is within reasonable walking distance. Any dorm that may be farther away than others is usually nicer, so it's worth the extra walk!

7 What food options are available on campus?

On campus, we have our dining hall, Einstein's Bagel, Dunkin' Donuts, Subway, Jazzman's Coffee, Chic-Fil-A and a couple of "Simply To-Go" stations that have light lunches or things that can be eaten on the run.

8 What's the best restaurant on campus or nearby?

There is Lupi's Pizza Pies right down the road from campus as well as The Spot and Gardner's Market which are located in our "downtown" area which is right next to campus. As far as local hot spots, Jenkin's Deli is always a favorite as well as any of our many Mexican restaurants (a student favorite is Tres Hermanos). Perkits Yogurt is another local favorite for anyone's sweet tooth!

9 What is the best local activity or "thing to do"?

We are about 30-45min away from the downtown Chattanooga area, which is great for walking and hanging out with large groups. As far as local activities, most students enjoy hanging out near the Rec Center every night at the basketball and volleyball courts or going to see a movie at our local movie theatre, Premier. If you are looking for an activity with a little more adventure white water rafting down our Ocoee River is also very popular.

10 Why should you choose our campus?

We have a beautiful campus and most youth ministers love coming to visit the area. Our University is one of the most popular Christian Liberal Arts Universities and continues to grow each year. We love having students filling the emptiness of our students being gone, keeping our campus busy!
